Service News

CADS MH ODHB provider arm. Methadone work 50% of load, 6 month waiting list, interim prescribing while waiting, rural area longer and no interim waiting list. Input in screening at Milburn Prison, scope for involvement but resources problematic –; Mirror Counselling, increased FTEs, counselling now up and running, new staff big expansion. Intake – designated workers also provide intervention, wait list down but unlikely to remain this way. Groups running – young people with violent behaviour, excessive AOD use. Māori worker, Day Programme challenging, full capacity. Prep for next year 1st term, level of complex needs more suitable to residential but prefer day. Youth Residential intensive support. Active growth at present. Audit – all staff must be registered under HPCA Act, sourcing how to get them registered who don't meet the criteria at present. Moana House news: Training Institute NZQA Te Aka and Te Rea training programmes. Diploma level 6 offered next year, DAPAANZ recognised courses. Otago Polytech component includes counselling course.

Te Whakaruruhau Youth Residential Care / Intensive Community Support Service

Focus to meet specific needs for this group

Opening first House tomorrow, 2nd up and running in April 2008

13 – 16 years

Youth with long term problems attending day services out of town is an attractive option to hospital, observations / assessment etc

Referrals through clinical case manager, group then to process who goes into which house, length of stay up to 3 months

Planned entry

Includes work with family/whanau/caregivers

Education needs arranged

Mobile Support Service – support worker role if required

Recruitment of staff coming to an end, new staff progressing through orientation and training where required

Q: Detox? Will this service be able to work with this?

A: Yes good team.

Q: Require buy in from the clients?

A: Need buy in before, will have a preparation period. May need to work on it in this stage.

Q: Issues with conduct Disorders ie more complex

A: Depends on matching and needs

Q: Open groups?

A: yes, also depends on what is happening in the house

Q: Provision of wider family / whanau?

A: Have .5 FTE to work with family/whanau work. Aim to keep the family involved in one way or another.

Q: Level of staffing?

A: One sleep over staff with overlaps morning and afternoon

Q: School holidays?

A: Remain open with alternative activities.

Q: Do you anticipate once only stays?

A: May have leave then return depends on what stage individuals are at when they arrive.

Review of AOD services across the region
